ELECTIONS . . . AGAIN?

This year is an election year, and one can be forgiven for asking, "again?"

We do have a lot of elections in Wisconsin. Although they may be aggravating and seemingly unending, we are fortunate to have them. The Church praises countries in

which "procedures ... allow the largest possible number of citizens to participate in public affairs with genuine freedom," and these freedoms do not exist for 37% of people in the world. Let us be grateful for our opportunity to select our leaders.

As our elected leaders, they deserve our respect, but not our deference. Our dignity as human persons requires all of us to pursue the common good and create and support institutions that improve the conditions of human life. Of course, what these institutions look like and how they function is what we should be debating in our political discussions. Too often we are distracted by who is winning and who is losing. We often consider the electoral ramifications of a particular policy instead of considering its effects on our society and, in particular, those with little or no voice.

Let's use the freedoms we have to find out who our leaders are and what policies they support. Let's use the freedoms we have to vote. Let's use the freedoms we have to hold our elected leaders accountable once they start to govern.

TOOLKITS DESIGNED TO HELP BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE

The USCCB produces new materials each year as tools to help parish leaders build a culture of life. The materials are meant to supplement existing methods of sharing the faith and to help integrate the joyful message of our God-given dignity across the breadth of Catholic life, work and ministry. Images, prayers, homily notes, and petitions are available in printed and digital resources, in both English and Spanish. Materials will assist each of these ministries:

In early June, our office will order one new Respect Life Kit for every parish within the archdiocese, plus provide 100 kits for our active deacons. Kits include a poster, sample brochures, and other resources to help a parish prepare for various activities and Respect Life Masses. Materials usually ship in early or mid-August.

2018 SOCIAL ACTION SUMMER INSTITUTE

Social justice ministry is dedicated to serving those individuals on the margins of society and within our Church, yet the way in which we minister must evolve. How can social action directors fully embrace the Holy Father's call to missionary discipleship in order to advance God's kingdom of peace and justice? What creative, new methods, new visions can be utilized? The 2018 Social Action Summer Institute (SASI) will provide fresh ideas and strategies for social ministers to bring back to their parish community.

SASI is a five-day program that offers first-time participants grounding in Catholic social teaching, biblical theology, and the spirituality of social justice. Returning attendees take part in an advanced program focused on particular areas of social action ministry. SASI is planned jointly with national collaborators from the
